## Important information



Themes: <u>Facing one's fears</u> - as much as his mother's stories about the woods stoke Billy's curiosity, it is also clear that she has succeeded in spooking him. When he first enters the "Forest of Sin" it is described in imagery that successfully conveys this impact upon him.

<u>Collaboration</u> - The collection of food requires a systematic collaborative effort by all the adult Minpins with the assistance of birds acting as their means of transportation.

Context The son of Norwegian parents, Roald Dahl was born in Wales in 1916 and educated at Repton. He was a fighter pilot for the RAF during World War Two, and it was while writing about his experiences during this time that he started his career as an author. His fabulously popular children's books are read by children all over the world. Some of his better-known works include James and the Giant Peach, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, Fantastic Mr Fox, Matilda, The Witches, and The BFG. He died in November 1990.
