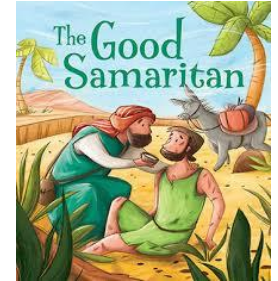


# Year 6 Knowledge Organiser - What matters most to Christians and Humanists?

- base their moral principles on reason, shared human values and respect for others.
- think that people should work together to improve the quality of life for all.
- have a code for living based on being honest, using your mind, telling the truth, do what people would like them to do to you

<u>Keyword</u>	<u>Definition</u>
<b>secular</b>	Not connected with religion or spiritual matters.
<b>Atheism</b>	A lack of belief in God but don't indicate what they believe in instead.
<b>Morals</b>	standards of behaviour; principles of right and wrong.
<b>Ten commandments</b>	Christian codes for living
<b>Worldview</b>	Your ideas about life or the world. The foundation that your beliefs, actions, decisions and opinions are based on
