The Holy Spirit-The Holy Spirit is the third part of the Trinity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit that is the way Christians understand God.

Why Is Pentecost Special?

After the disciples were given the Holy Spirit, they were able to speak different languages. This meant they could travel around the world, telling everyone about God and the life of Jesus. This also meant that they were not alone.

Symbols of Pentecost

Ministers wear red - Red is a sign of Pentecost. It represents the flames, which appeared when the disciples were given the Holy Spirit.



A dove - A dove appeared when Jesus received the Holy Spirit at his baptism.



Wind - A powerful wind was felt when the disciples were given the Holy Spirit.



Pentecost is:

- a Christian event;
- when people celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit;
- celebrated 50 days after Easter.

What Is the Gift of the Holy Spirit?

The gift of the Holy Spirit meant that the disciples were not left alone. They had the courage to talk to people about Jesus.
