Uniform

Even though we are experiencing lovely warm weather, children are expected to wear school uniform each day. Please see below suggested items that could be worn during the summer weather, with black shoes or trainers







For PE, children are expected to wear the school PE kit.



Uniform items can be purchased new through the shop section on Parent Mail. We have a stock of nearly new items that can be purchased for £1 each too. Please contact the school office for more information.

Accessories and Make-up

A reminder that children should leave necklaces, bracelets and dangly earrings etc.. at home unless they are worn as part of religious observance. The risks of a serious injury increase when children wear these sorts of items in school.

We are also noticing children in school wearing make-up (mascara, eye shadow etc..) and with hair dyed in bright colours. Please keep the use of these for the school holidays. Along with our school uniform, this all goes towards supporting positive behaviour, self-image and learning behaviours.

Covid- 19 On school site

We are still requesting that children do not arrive on the school grounds until their allocated time as this causes congestion and prevents others from getting to their classrooms safely. Also we ask that only 1 parent to drop off and collect if possible.

If you <u>or your child</u> have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

TOMATO BASED SAUCE



INGREDIENTS

48g Grated Carrot

8g Red Pepper

24g Courgette

24g Swede

4ml oil

1g Mixed Herbs

560g Plum tomatoes

400ml Water

4g Garlic puree

20g Tomato puree

Seasoning

METHOD

- 1 Wash peel and chop onions, pepper, courgette and Swede
- 2 Add to oil and cook until slightly soft
- 3 Stir in the garlic and herbs
- 4 Add tinned tomatoes tomato paste and water
- 5 Bring to the boil and simmer until all veg is cooked season and blend to a smooth sauce
