<u> Covid- 19</u>

<u>On school site</u>

Please see attached letter to parents/carers from Jane Moore and Mike Sandys, advising that parents/carers are no longer being requested to wear face coverings at school pick up and drop off.

<u>We are still requesting that children do not arrive on the school grounds until their allocated time</u> as this causes congestion and prevents others from getting to their classrooms safely. Also we ask that <u>only</u> <u>1 parent to drop off and collect if possible</u>.

If you <u>or your child</u> have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
