Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

At St Cuthbert's pupil premium funding is used in a variety of ways including learning interventions and providing personalised resources.

Pupils who receive this additional funding can also access free school uniform, after school clubs, school meals, and day trips. Funding can also be used to reduce the costs of extended provision and residential trips.
