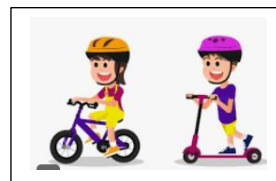

## Health and Safety reminders!

### Bikes and Scooters

If your child comes to school on a bike or scooter they must not ride them in the playground. This also includes younger siblings. This will create a safer environment for pedestrians along the path and hopefully avoid any unfortunate accidents. On entering the school grounds, please push it to the bike shelter or scooter stand.



### Coach arrival

It is still the intention for the Local Authority to provide coach travel for children to travel to and from school. The coach will drop off at around 8:40am and pick up at 3:40pm where The Chase joins Coverside Road. Staff will be present to walk the children to and from school. The roads are very narrow so we kindly ask that cars are not parked around this area to allow cars and the coach to pass by.



### Parking

Parents/ Carers who bring children to school by car **must not:**

- stop on the yellow lines outside the school entrance
- park on or in the school driveway/carpark
- park on any of the pavements near the school
- park in the school car park until after 6pm (this include drop off and pick up school or privately run clubs)

We also ask that you park considerately and do not obstruct driveways of neighbouring houses. St Cuthbert's and local residents seek your cooperation in resolving this issue by requesting that parents park sensibly and with due consideration for other road users.



### Dogs

Dogs should not be brought onto the playground (even if they are being carried). If you are waiting with your dog, please do not wait in the gateways. This is so that any child or adult with allergies' or anxieties can enter and exit the grounds without worry.

This does not include Guide or Assistance dogs.

### Drop off

Children should arrive at school no earlier than 8:45am unless they are going to Cuthbert's Club. Before this time, a child should be waiting with their parent or carer.

Please do not use equipment found on the playground or bring sporting equipment from home e.g. footballs to play with while waiting even if parents are there to supervise.

### Our school uniform is

- a school red sweatshirt or cardigan (available at the School Office) The majority of our pupils do wear the school sweatshirt but a plain red sweatshirt without logos is also acceptable.
- white polo-shirt
- **grey** trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress.
- Pupils should wear sensible footwear for school - plain white, black or grey socks with **black shoes or trainers.**

Please support us in ensuring girls skirts and dress are around knee length particularly in Years 5 and 6. Many girls choose to wear shorts underneath so they can do gymnastics at breaktimes, this is fine.

### PE kit

PE kit with the St Cuthbert's logo, can be purchased through MCAS and should be worn during PE sessions within school. Alternatively, please provide a plain red t-shirt and shorts. A pair of tracksuit bottoms and trainers are also advisable as we try can get the children outside as much as possible.

We recommend that PE kits come in to school on a Monday and are taken home on a Friday for washing. It is helpful to do this as occasionally due to unforeseen circumstances, PE sessions may need to change or we have an extra opportunity for the children to take part in a sporting activity. It also proves helpful should your child has a spillage or accident and need a quick change of clothes.

School PE kit should also be worn at sporting afterschool clubs. The exception to this is KS1 & 2 football.



### Safeguarding

Many children may start using mobile phones particularly if they are walking/travelling to school on their own or with friends. With that come worries and dangers about how our children are using their phones. Children who need to bring phones in to school e.g for walking home after a club or school or because they going to a friend's house, **MUST** hand their phone into the office when they first arrive in school. If a phone is found in the classroom or a child's bag, parents will be notified and the phone kept safe until the end of the day.

Here are some useful links for supporting parents in the setting up of controls on your child's phone to help keep them safe.

#### Setting up parental controls on your child's mobile

If you do not have the same mobile phone as your child, and therefore are unable to use Google Family link or Apple Family Sharing, then you can set restrictions on your child's device instead.

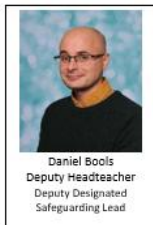
#### **Change of details**

ClassDojo

We continue to use Class Dojo as a communication tool between home and school.

Each week, (on a Wednesday is the aim) class teachers update the class page with information about the learning taking place the following week and the whole school story shares some snippets of the events we share on X.

All families already connected to Class Dojo, should be able to access their child's new class. If you have not yet connected to Dojo or are new to school, invites will be sent out next week on how to access this.

Please remember this does not replace Bromcom, which remains our main system for sharing information.

### Attendance and Absence

It is vital for your child's education that they attend school regularly and promptly.

If your child is absent due to illness or another reason, please ring the school office to inform us why your child is not in school or send an email. This is so we can record the type of absence and support your child on their return. We appreciate this can be tricky at times, but it avoids absences being marked as unauthorised and staff having to follow up on this with your child.

### Holiday in term time

Please note that the Government legislation guidance schools follow in making these decisions, rarely agrees to parents taking their children out of school for the purposes of a holiday in term-time. Holidays in term time can result in Local Authority issuing fixed penalty notices. Please ensure that you contact the School Office or email us with the information.

We are required to share our attendance and absence information or concerns in connection to all categories of absence to the LA as part of our safeguarding and obligations to the statutory guidance.
